Bobby Rahal BMW of South Hills PROTECH **TIP**

"Some of the most overlooked items during brake maintenance is the hardware associated with the brake system. This includes caliper mounting botts, springs and pins for the brake shoes or pads.

For example return springs along with adjuster and shoe expander for drum brake shoes and internal parking brake shoes should be replaced during shoe replacement.

Floating style brake calipers need to have the caliper retaining spring replaced after four years Caliper guide screws should be cleaned only, no grease should be used on them as it will attract dirt. This would cause the caliper to not slide properly. Replace any demaged guide screws or bushings showing damage.

Properly lube pad contact points per repair instructions using approved brake contact paste. Torque guide screws and caliper bracket boits to correct torque values.

On vehicles with fixed style calipers found on older classic vehicles and M-Sport vehicles installation of new pads is very important. Pad retaining pins and expanding springs need to be replaced on vehicles four years old and replaced every four years there after with pad replacement. Follow repair instructions for lubing contact points."

cal cars, a 1910 Duryea.

Mr. Crawford, aware of the impact of the Durvea brothers to early automotive history, had Thompson Products purchase the car, and display it in their factory.

Inspired by his rescue of the Duryea, Mr. Crawford set out to try and save other early automobiles threatened with destruction. He instructed his Thompson Products salesmen to keep on the lookout for antique automobiles as they

served their sales regions, and to inform him if they located anything worthy of collecting.

When they would locate an interesting car, they would wire Mr. Crawford, who would authorize the purchase and shipping of the vehicle back to Cleveland.

Many of these cars were found in barns and garages, and could be had for virtually nothing. (*** as told by the museum website) http://www.wrhs.org/ research/crawford/autos/

Day in Daytona is Event of Lifetime

Rolex 24-Hour Sports Car Endurance Race Excites Night and Day

"There are four seats available for hot laps in M4's, but we have to get to the pit area right now!" Well, that kind of announcement will wake up the most reluctant riser after a night of pre-Rolex 24 celebrating. This is the way we started our first morning in the motor coach parked track side with our Allegheny Chapter friends, Brett and Dee Sutton. Poof... we're outa' there! It's nice to know people in high places.

"Print and sign, here is your wrist band, go to the pit out gate over there!" barks our escort at the waiver tent. We wait just a few moments and the gate opens allowing us onto the flat part of the track

at the end of turn 4, where we see three M4 Grand Coupes, dressed in BMW Motorsports livery, and the familiar face of Mike Renner standing beside the last one. Mike is lead driving instructor at the BMW Performance Center M Driving School at Spartanburg, SC and well known hot shoe/hooligan who pilots many charity rides at BMWCCA events across the country. Of course, we move to the end to get in his car. Sonja and I hop in the back and Dee in the front. Brett went on the next lap where he videoed the unbelievable experience on his phone (see https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9-DqR7fS-FGU) Few tracks in the world are as legendary or have the storied history as the Daytona International Speedway. Most

folks know this track as the home of the NASCAR Daytona 500, with its tri-oval layout. This year's Rolex 24 was the first event and grand opening after this winter's 400 million dollar re-imagining of the "World's Center of Racing" facility. It was also the kickoff of the IMSA 2016 racing season and is the 54th running of the famed Rolex 24. I couldn't be happier to have been there for it. The Rolex 24 race uses almost all of the tri, but diverts into the infield at the end of 'pit out', just before turn 1. The infield por-


tion is pretty flat and very intense. It has several slow speed curves, some short straights and two 180's, named "horseshoes" (both are right handers), before shooting back onto the high bank of turns 1 & 2. When we slid into that banking at full tilt boogie with fun pedal fully mashed, it felt and looked like we were blasting off for a moon launch. We were right on the tail of the M4 in front of us, which was hugging the wall. If I had the window down and my arm resting on the ledge, I could have easily touched the wall with my elbow. The speedo needle was pointing downward before the end of the corner. To make 'The 24' more interesting and challenging, there is a chicane just after the middle of the backstretch, called the "bus stop". Before Mr. Renner began braking for this, I thought we were just gonna stay on the 15° banking and go straight on through. When he finally did brake, then diverted down towards the bus stop, our eyes bugged out like cartoon characters. Over the rumble strips on all four corners with masterful flicks of the wheel and we were blasting back up on the 15° banking, on our way to the 30° banking of turns 3 & 4. When you watch the video, keep in mind it looks really slow compared to the way it feels, but it does give a pretty good impression of just how steep the banking is.

When he landed this rocket and we got out, I realized my knees were shaking, I felt a little beat up, my heart rate was elevated and I was breathing harder than at the end of our jog over there. This, after riding for one, three-minute lap in an expertly piloted luxury car. The professional drivers would later endure this pounding for 90 minute stints in very harsh suspension race cars, performing 36 gear shifts per 3.56 mile lap, while trying to shave off every tenth of a second at every opportunity... all while passing slower classes of cars and being passed by faster classes of cars. What's this you say? Four classes of cars on the same track at the same time?

Yes, for 24 hours straight.

What could possibly go wrong? I gained an even higher level of respect and admiration for the incredible skill and stamina required to be a race car driver.

teams who venture into this grueling sport welcome the considerable challenge of building and maintaining a machine that can withstand this 24-hour torture test and do so faster than the other guys. BMW is debuting four brand new racing versions of the M6, with all new technology and a chassis powered by a new V8 racing engine, featuring reverse flow and two turbo chargers, nestled in the engine's V. To quote Will Turner of Turner Motorsports GTD, "It's like putting together a new football team just two weeks before the Super Bowl." The Rahal, Letterman, Lanigan Racing team had two of the M6's in the GTLM class. The GTLM class is my favorite and I was excited to see the new M6's of course, but Ford had its spectacular new Ford GT's in the hunt and Lamborghini entered new Lamborghini Hurac. ns. Aston Martin showed up with its stunningly beautiful DB9's and there were fierce looking Dodge Vipers. But this season opener would turn out to be a battle of the old proven technology of the Porsche's and push-rod-engine Corvettes against the new everything in the Fords and BMW's Anytime you have Ford, Chevy, Ferrari, and BMW competing against each other, you know everybody is pulling out all the stops.

Fierce rivalries and much tradition at stake makes for a very intense competition. Everyone involved is fully aware of the slogan, "Win on Sunday, sell on Monday," but mostly, the drivers want to win and receive one of those coveted Rolex Oyster Perpetual wrist watches and the bragging rights that go along with it. To do that you must stay out of trouble for 23 hours and save some car for the last hour and be in a position to lead that all-important last lap. Bit of a challenge, to say the least.

A big part of the excitement of this race is being there in the infield long after dark, where you are treated to a fireworks show in the sky, as well as the one on the track. While the strategists are calculating how to save some car for the end, while remaining within striking distance, you are free to roam around and find that perfect spot to watch and mingle with the other dedicated racing fans. I've said this before: there is nothing like the passion and camaraderie of car nuts. Several nice folks helped direct me to the curve that had the best viewing of glowing brake rotors. A perfect shot of your favorite car with it's brake rotors aglow like sparklers from the heat proved quite difficult to capture with a

cell phone camera held over a fence higher than your head, but I had a lot of fun trying.

Speaking of hot rotors, the 100 car of RLL suffered a dramatic brake rotor failure at about 2:00 am, resulting in a nose-first crash into the outside wall, disabling the race car. Too bad, because it was performing quite well up till then and looked pretty darn cool at night with it's 100th anniversary reflective cloak glowing as it charged around the track. Schools Teach Skills, Safety

Chapter Promotes Drivers' Lessons

"To encourage safe and skillful driving classes", this was written into our by-laws as a founding purpose of the chapter. While we don't currently put on drivers' schools, we still want to promote them, so let's talk about going to those that are available.

What is a Drivers' School?

An event designed to improve your driving skills. A school provides you with classroom instruction on the theory and methods of proper and safe driving and hands on experience in your own car. You will be taught by a group of instructors with backgrounds of event, driving, teaching and racing experience. Schools are held at a race tracks to provide a safe controlled area where you can concentrate on sharpening your skills without having to worry about others who don't take their or your driving seriously. A school is also a social event where you get to spend time with a diverse group of people who all share the interest of being better drivers. And, of course, it is fun!

Is it safe?

One of the most stressed topic at a Drivers' School is Safety. You will have sole control of your car. You will not be pushed into doing things

you don't want to. You will be grouped with drivers having similar experience. Only one group of drivers will be on the track at one time. Each driver will have an instructor riding in the car until you both feel you are ready to drive the track solo. Cars will only be side by side when passing and then only in designated passing areas. Any driver acting in an unsafe manner will be excluded from the event. In case of any problems, paramedics standing by for you and a tow truck for your car.

What preparation is required?

You need to schedule and prepare well in advance of a school. Registration is typically months in advance. (I'm already registered for my season's 16 track days through October) You will need car inspected to make sure that it is in compliance with the technical requirements of the school. You will need a driving helmet. For out of town events, you will also need travel and accommodations.

What events are available?

There are seven tracks in a 300 mile radius of Pittsburgh. BMW clubs hold events at most of them as do other car clubs and some tracks hold their own.

Locally, the Allegheny Region Porsche club and PittRace hold events at the PittRace facility. While all events a e similar, each organization has their own curricula and does things their own way. Facilities also differ, Summit Point has skid pads available while allow for teaching car control.

How will the Allegheny **Chapter promote Drivers'** Schools?

The Driving Events Committee has a proposal pending to list schools in our calendar and subsidize BMW club member attendance at PitRace events via a 10% rebate. Watch your chapter publications to see if it is passed at the next business meeting.

BRAKE DOWN

A Letter from a Father to His Son

The Most Powerful Part of a Vehicle is the Brakes

BY GLEN BEATIE

Hi Son,

Here's something for you to ponder.

If you asked drivers which component of their car was the most powerful, almost everyone would say the engine (although some might say the radio <->).

But in fact, the most powerful component is the brakes.

A typical car can accelerate from 0 to 60 in about 7 seconds and brake from 60 to 0 in about 4 seconds. So in terms of energy-per-unit-time, the brakes are almost twice as powerful as the engine.

Few drivers think about the implications. The brakes convert kinetic energy to heat through friction. If you've ever

touched your brake rotors reduced to 284°F. right after a drive, you probably burned your fingers. The amount of energy it takes to stop a 4,000 lb. car from 60 MPH is enormous. And yet can lead to "mushy" brakes. modern automobile brakes are so reliable (they have to be), that we rarely give it a thought.

There are two brake-related items that deserve attention.

The first is the brake fluid. DOT 3 brake fluid is hydroscopic and will absorb water from the atmosphere. This degrades the fluid's performance and if allowed to accumulate over a period of time, can drastically reduce its boiling point. New DOT3 fluid has a boiling point of 401°F. But after it is absorbed 3.7% water by volume, the boiling point is

This can allow a water vapor bubble to form in the brake line near the hot brakes. Water vapor is compressible, so this

Most car manufacturers recommend changing the brake fluid every 3 years, regardless of mileage.

Your sister recently experienced this herself. Coming down from Yosemite National Park she stayed in 5th gear and rode the brakes down the mountain. About halfway down, the brake pedal went all the way to the floor. She managed to pull off into a rest area and stop. Her brakes were incredibly hot. Even the dust shields on the front brakes were hot enough to boil water. We let them cool for about 45 minutes and then continued down the mountain using engine compression to assist the brakes.

As soon as she got home, she had the brake fluid changed.

The second item is the brake pads. Although you

can "safely" wear them down to about 2/32", they start to lose their ability to dissipate the heat at about 4/32". So to protect the rotors, they should be changed early. If you wait until the brakes are making squealing noises you've almost certainly caused damage not to mention that the car is dangerous to drive.

The point I'm trying to make is that a 3-year-old car with 40,000 miles that's never had any brake work deserves a brake fluid flush and a detailed inspection. A convenient time to do it is when you buy new tires.
