What was once a racing event is now a 2,000-vehicle international car show with food and vendors across the Bob O'Conner Golf Course where spectators (usually numbering close to 200,000) overlook the races (now featuring a total of over 180 historic race cars) held on the city streets below. The BMW CCA's portion of PVGP has grown, too; the event is no longer a two-day car corral, but a complete four-day program that offers something



"Some of the most overlooked items during brake maintenance is the hardware associated with the brake system. This includes caliper mounting bolts, springs and pins for the brake shoes or pads.

For example return springs along with adjuster and shoe expander for drum brake shoes and internal parking brake shoes should be replaced during shoe replacement.

Floating style brake calipers need to have the caliper retaining spring replaced after four years Caliper guide screws should be cleaned only, no grease should be used on them as it will attract dirt. This would cause the caliper to not slide properly. Replace any damaged guide screws or bushings showing damage.

Properly lube pad contact points per repair instructions using approved brake contact paste. Torque guide screws and caliper bracket boits to correct torque values.

On vehicles with fixed style calipers found on older classic vehicles and M-Sport vehicles installation of new pads is very important. Pad retaining pins and expanding springs need to be replaced on vehicles four years cld and replaced every four years there after with pad replacement. Follow repair instructions for lubing contact points."

Annual Vintage Event Heats Up for BMW's 100th Year Celebration





Race Originates from Screenwriter of Cannonball Run in Early 1970s

In the early 1970's Brock excess of the posted limits, Mr. Yates, senior editor of Car and Driver Magazine created the now infamous Cannonball Sea-to-Shining-Sea Memorial Trophy Dash; a flat out, no-holds-barred race from New York City to Redondo Beach, California. ting out to prove that competent, well trained drivers can indeed safely navigate the American highways at speeds somewhat in

Yates created a spectacle reminiscent of the days of the barnstorming pilots. But after five successful events with none of the slaughter and mayhem predicted by the safety nazis; five events where the continent was ultimately traversed in 32 hours 51 minutes, Mr. Yates decided that he had made his point and it was now time to cash in with writing the screenplays for Cannonball Run and Smokey and the Bandit II. (And, to be honest, Yates recognized that it was only a matter of time before some militant, safetycrazed prosecutor would bring him up before a grand jury.)

Brock then set out to create a motorsports event that was accessable to the average Joe while capturing the excitement, lunacy and romance of the Cannonball without the threat of being called to testify in front of a Senate sub-committee. And so, in 1984, the first Cannonball One Lap of America was run with the start/finish in Darien, Connecticut. That year, the format was simple: circumnavigate the lower 48 United States and "guess Brock's mileage." team that came closest to Brock's distance won. Brock is the first to admit that this format had its flaws and expected 1984 to be the first and last One Lap. To his dismay, he was flooded with inquiries requesting entry in the following year's event. A kinder, gentler successor to Cannonball had been born.


Chapter Holds Annual Meeting
